As we light our third Advent Candle, we celebrate the Joy of having You in our lives.

We light the Advent Candle and remind ourselves of the ways You bring Joy into our world, and we live in the Hope that You will use us to bring about Joy in our world this Advent Season.

Prayers

Loving God, you have given us so many gifts – the gifts we have named in this space and many more gifts that we remember in silence.

We confess the times we focus on what is hard, or difficult, or lacking in our lives, instead of recognising what we do have and responding to those things with joy.

We confess the times we confuse happiness with joy and so seek short term solutions, or try to fill our lives with stuff, rather than cultivating true joy that carries us through times of difficulty.

We confess that we sometimes abuse people by making them paper over their problems and put on a happy face because it makes us feel uncomfortable or challenges us to respond more deeply. Cultivate in us an attitude of true joy at the future you offer with hope and the comfort you offer now. Amen.

Words of Assurance

Is the same way John the Baptiser accompanied people through the ritual washing represented in baptism, so too are you accompanied by Jesus the Christ as you seek to walk a new way in relationship with other people and with God.

Christmas Bowl Story*

Twelve long years have passed since Rima*, her husband Kateb*, and their five children fled their beloved home in Syria as the devastating civil war unfolded. Their once-happy life, built around a flourishing farm cultivating pistachios, olives, and potatoes, was abruptly shattered by the conflict.

Forced to leave everything behind, they sought refuge in Jordan, carrying with them only the essentials. With global attention now moved on to other crises, families like Rima's worry that the world has forgotten their plight.

Thankfully, Act for Peace's partner in Jordan, the Department of Service to Palestinian Refugees (DSPR), has been supporting Syrian refugees since the war began, providing vital food packages and hygiene kits, as well as the long-term support they need to rebuild their lives. Through this ongoing support, as well as small business training, Rima is now able to bring in an income for her family by selling Syrian food.

Through the Christmas Bowl, you'll help Syrian refugees like Rima receive the support they desperately need and show them they're not forgotten.

We thank you for pistachios, olives, and sweet pineapples. We thank you for Rima^{*} and Kateb^{*} and the joy they experienced on their farm. We pray for all people leaving their family farms and moving across borders seeking safety. We pray especially for the families fleeing Syria.

We pray that your Joy will reign and that Rima and Kateb, and people in their situation may return to their family farm. Amen.
