# Christmas Bowl Story\*

Sara\* fled to Ethiopia from Yemen eight years ago with her four children. She left when she became scared that her young boys would be forced to join the war.

They found their way to the capital Addis Ababa, home to some of the most marginalised refugees, many of whom are women and girls who have survived extreme gender-based violence. With limited ways to earn an income, they are at risk of severe exploitation, with little access to education, medical care or basics like food.

Adding to Sara's burden, one of her sons suffers from scoliosis, and she struggled to find the medical care he needed.

"I want my children to be happy and have good health, a good education and a better life. I'm tired because I'm trying to face all these problems alone."

Act for Peace's local partner, The Ethiopian Orthodox Church Development and Inter-Church Aid Commission (EOC\_DICAC), supports refugees like Sara. They helped provide her with livelihoods training and medical treatment for her son.

Sara explained, "I learnt a lot from that training. I learnt the traditional foods of Ethiopia, as well as how to make cookies. I improved my skills, and I made friends with other refugees. I learnt a lot and I feel good about that... If I have problem, I go to DICAC, they help me, they give me information if I have any problem and they support me a lot."

Through the Christmas Bowl, you are helping EOC-DICAC to continue providing medical and psychosocial care and helping to protect girls and women from gender-based violence. Together we are giving people like Sara the chance to make a living and create safer, stronger futures for their families.

May our communities be places of welcome and inclusion, especially for those living below the poverty line. May we be communities that love generously.
