Listen! From the distance we hear the crowd reciting psalms, as is the tradition of the pilgrims who approach Jerusalem. We hear their song gathering and growing in strength as they draw closer. We too find ourselves in that crowd, so let us join in the psalm of praise.

Prayer of Confession

Loving God, as the Pilgrims once gathered from across the world to celebrate the Passover in the city of Jerusalem, so too, do we gather, to remind ourselves of what it means to be your people, and celebrate the freedom you give to all your children.

Sometimes we hear your invitation to freedom and make assumptions of what that looks like transferring our values onto you or assuming that our understanding is correct.

When we join the crowds expecting a military messiah,

loving God, forgive us.

Sometimes we get caught up in the emotion of the crowd and allow ourselves to be swept along in popular causes, rather than listening to what you are really saying. When we join the crowds

because it is the easy thing to do,

loving God, forgive us.

Sometimes we fail to notice the others in the crowd, who are valued by you and need our care.

When we join the crowds making your entry about us, **loving God, forgive us.**

Gather us all in and help us become disciples willing to follow you through all the challenges of life.

Help us to hear and respond to your invitation to a fullness of life; help us to share that invitation with all your beloved children. **Amen.**

Prayer of Intercession

As the Passover approaches, we remember the stories of rescue from slavery, and pray for the people of the world who lack freedom in their lives.

We pray for those who are caught up in modern-day slavery; workers in sweatshops who make our clothes, people who are trafficked, people in Australia and overseas.

We pray for people whose decisions are taken from them, because of disability, or assumptions about their capacity.

We pray for those who are oppressed because of their differences,

or differences that frighten or challenge people.

We pray for those who work for freedom of those who lack it, especially those who risk their lives in its pursuit. Amen.
