Call to Worship

Dogs bark and birds sing for joy in praise of God.

Crickets chirp and emus drum in praise of God.

All creation calls out in the ways they can: and we too join in in praise of God.

Let us worship God.

Prayers

God of all beings –
and not just God of humans –
as we thank you for loving
all creatures great and small,
we also confess the times
when our love has been too short sighted,
too focused on the animals we know
and the animas to whom we relate.

When we think of the tiny microbes as being insignificant because they are so small that we do not see them, and yet we forget that, if nothing else, they are an important part of the food chain: God of all creatures, forgive us.

When animals scare us or disgust us and we want to rid our world of them even when they do not hurt us:

God of all creatures, forgive us.

When we only see the negatives of animals known for their bites and stings, and fail to see what they offer, us as humans, or to all creation:

God of all creatures, forgive us.

When we fail to consider the impact that our lives have on the animals in our world, so species are endangered in order to give us a home, or the technology that helps us, or simply because we do not care:

God of all creatures, forgive us.

When we look at animals and only care for them because they are useful to us and meet our needs in some way, rather than to remember how we affect them all from great to small:

God of all creatures, forgive us.

Help us to start again in new and fresh ways to share your love, not only with people like us, not only with other humans, but with all who inhabit this world you created and in which we live.

God's love is indeed for all, and that includes each of us.

Through knowing we are loved, we can repent – we can have a change of heart that brings change to our actions.

Prayer of Intercession

Creator God, we pray for the needs of our world and especially pray for the needs of the animals who inhabit it.

We give thanks for and pray for the animals who work each day to help human society – sheep dogs, police dogs, the bomb-seeker rats, and companion animals in nursing homes.

We pray for the livestock, the animals that provide us with food and clothing, especially for those animals who are themselves a source of our food;

we pray for humane care, for love, and compassion. We pray for the wild animals especially those losing access to the lands they have roamed for millennia, to food and clean water, and those who are hunted by poachers, or are threatened with extinction.

We pray for our pets, the animals who bring such joy into our lives, who companion us on our journey of life, and comfort us when times are hard.

Finally, we pray for all the people who dedicate their lives to making life better for animals; we remember scientists, like Jane Goodall, the vets in our local practices, those who protect the environment, or find out how to care for the fish in our reefs: zoologists, ecologists, and many others who all working together create a better world for animals, and a better world for all. Amen.
