# Prayer of Intercession

There has been plenty of items in the news this week. Take a moment to cast your mind around the news and see what is a piece of news that leaps out. It might be local, national, or international; don't think about why that news came to you, simply hold it.

Reflect on what you remember about that piece of news – who, what, when, where, how, why.

Pray for the people who were involved – the people featured in the article, and the people they represent in our society.

Pray for anyone hurt by that news – those mentioned who have been injured, the people they represent in wider society, the people for whom this news has triggered old pain.

Pray for the people who caused the news, especially when the cause was malicious or just out of stupidity; then pray for the people they represent.

Pray for the people who make a difference into that situation – first responders, professionals, volunteers who care.

Finally, pray for yourself and this community that when we are faced by people in trouble, we may learn to make a difference where we can. Amen.
