Prayer of Intercession

For the people whose lives have been torn apart by racial profiling and illegal deportations:

For the people whose disabilities mean they experience exclusion and are torn from their society by rejection:

we pray, O God, grant them healing and hope.

For the families torn apart by domestic and family violence that diminishes all who experience it:

we pray, O God, grant them healing and hope.

For all those who struggle with what the future may hold and live in uncertain times:

we pray, O God, grant them healing and hope.

For the people who cause disruption, pain, struggle, and torn apart lives:

teach them, O God, to live with healing, hope, and compassion.

For us and our community, as we face the future being your church in this time and place:

teach us, O God, to live with healing, hope, and compassion. Amen.

As in Christ your love flowed out to those around him, so let your love flow through us to others.

As in Christ your life was broken, so let your life meet us in our brokenness and release hope in us and others, through Jesus our hope and our life.
