# Call to Worship

Let us gather in fellowship as generations before us have done; let us be a community of Christ, and part of that community from every country of the world.

When we fail to see others as human beings loved by you:

forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Amen.

### Words of Assurance

Repentance is more than just words – it is a commitment to try to set things right.

When we repent, God is faithful and helps us start again; know that you are forgiven:

Thanks be to God.

# Prayer of Intercession

Loving God,
the needs of our world are many
and you know them all,
as we raise the needs in prayer,
we are also aware that you challenge us
to think about our neighbour,
all the people with whom we are in fellowship,
and how we can be an answer to prayer.

For the lonely in our communities, the people with few friends, or little time to build relationships, enfold them in your circle of love. For the people who are isolated, rejected by those around them, or unwanted by society, enfold them in your circle of love.

For the children who experience bullying, whose self-worth has been ground down by those around them:

enfold them in your circle of love.

For those who have fractured relationships, partnerships that hang together by a thread, or that are full of domestic and family violence: **enfold them in your circle of love**.

For those who are separated from their loved ones, by distance, imprisonment, or disability;

enfold them in your circle of love.

For those whose need is so basic, that they are focused more on survival than on their relationships: enfold them in your circle of love.

For all of us, that we may know your love and share your love until all the people around us know they too are loved: enfold us in your circle of love. Amen.

# Prayer after communion

Give us the courage to ensure those leftovers do not go to waste; remind us to gather them up so they may be taken to those who cannot be here.
